The meeting was called to order at 10:37 a.m. by Mr. Guarino.

Mr. Guarino made modifications to the agenda; approval of the minutes was moved to later in the day when a quorum would be present.

### **Funding:**

- EIA Program Report for Education Oversight Committee submitted and presented by Dean Lemuel Watson for the Center for Educational Partnerships (CEP) on 10/13/14 requested an additional \$90,000 for FY2015-16. SC-SIC requested an additional \$50,000 of this funding.

**Claudia Parnell, SC-SIC Digital and Web Director****SC-SIC website:**

The 2013-14 Training Schedule has been archived on the SIC Training Dates and Locations page of the SC-SIC website, <http://sic.sc.gov>, at <http://sic.sc.gov/TrainingAndResources/Documents/SIC%202013-14%20trainings%20for%20web.pdf>. The 2014-15 schedule is displayed; we have completed 19 trainings as of 11/21/14. Over 464 individuals were trained as of 11/18/14; this number does not include trainings conducted by SIC District Contacts who may not yet have reported their training numbers to the state office.

Current Home page highlights include reminders to Councils to report their SIC membership to SC-SIC by November 15, a description of and link to *In the Loop*, SC-SIC newest emailed publication for SIC members and friends, and a link to competitions and workshops currently being offered by SC Economics. Offerings for SIC brochures and lapel pins are featured, as is the link for the current issue of the SIC handbook, *The Basics*. (2012 edition.) SIC District Contacts and members are being asked to download and use this version of the handbook while the latest edition is in production.

SC-SIC is working with our hosting company, SC Interactive, to upgrade the programming behind the website so that it is more user-friendly across all platforms, including tablet and mobile. This is expected to take several months.

**SC-SIC Member Network:**

- Total number of schools falling under laws governing SICs as of 11/17/14: **1,137** (This figure does not include 3 schools that convene SICs but are not mandated to do so.) These are the latest available numbers reported to us by the schools and/or districts.
- Total number of schools reporting SIC membership as of 11/17/14: **849** (This number includes 3 schools that are not mandated to convene SICs and 16 schools that are partially updated.)
- Total number of schools that had not updated their SIC membership as of 11/17/14: **291**
- Total number of SIC members reported as of 11/17/14: **11,229**.
- Total number of SICs in compliance as of 11/17/14: **767**. (This number includes 3 “Career, Tech and Other” category schools, which are not mandated to convene SICs.)
- Total number of SICs out of compliance as of 11/17/14: **373**.

It should be noted that SC-SIC allows a “grace period” of approximately 1.5 months and gathers a second set of reporting data on January 2. Historically, reporting and compliance numbers improve significantly as late schools complete their SIC reporting tasks.

**Report to the Parents Uploads:**

**824 Reports to the Parents** were uploaded by SC-SIC Member Network users for the 2013-14 school year. This reflects a steady yearly increase in uploads since the function was first initiated in 2010.

421 *Reports* were uploaded to the database for 2010-11, 563 for 2011-12, and 692 for 2012-13. Councils are encouraged to continue to upload their *Reports* after the deadline, so *Reports* for earlier years may continue to be added.

**Report to the Parents Uploads, continued:**

SICs have demonstrated a willingness to share their *Reports* via the *Member Network* database and are strongly encouraged to do so by a majority of the school districts. By mandate, the *Report to the Parents* must be distributed to the community by April 30 of each year; SICs voluntarily upload *Reports* to the *Member Network*.

*Reports* are available for public viewing via the **View the SIC Members (Read-Only)** link on the SC-SIC *Member Network*. (<https://sic.ed.sc.edu/network/>)

The *Report to the Parents* offers publicly accessible information about what Councils across South Carolina are doing and accomplishing.

**Social Media:**

The SC-SIC Twitter account now has 1,699 followers (up from 1,617 as of 09/12/14). Use of Twitter by SC-SIC provides a communications conduit to education groups and professionals across the country as well as accelerated access to education and civic engagement news, blogs and journal articles on a wide variety of topics, and immediate contact with the community. Media personnel, political figures and key education players in South Carolina and beyond follow @SCSIC and often “retweet” or mention @SCSIC (our Twitter “handle”) in their tweets, continuing to raise our public profile and advancing a key strategic planning goal. Among @SCSIC followers are several educators, political figures, organizations, and media personnel from other states and countries. Also of great use is the accessibility of breaking news obtainable through Twitter lists of media, education outlets and those involved in the South Carolina political landscape.

The SC-SIC Facebook Page has 609 “Likes” (up from 588 as of 09/12/14). Many links to information and articles that are shared on Twitter are also posted here, though less in number due to the real-time posting and faster pace of Twitter. Posts are updated each business day. SC-SIC’s last 3 posts showed a Facebook “reach” (the number of people the post was served to, either via newsfeed or share) of 1,511, a 123% increase over the previous week. We attribute this to the excitement over the SC Supreme Court’s finding in the school equity suit. SC-SIC was among the first to share this news among numerous education organizations and local, state and national media. SC-SIC learned of the court’s finding via Twitter.

Facebook, like Twitter, serves to increase our search engine rankings, again advancing our public profile. We encourage Councils to have their own Facebook pages and /or Twitter accounts to facilitate communication among members and to inform the school community of ongoing projects.

It should be noted that each quarter has shown an increase in Facebook and Twitter followers. Social media has proven to be an essential tool in maintaining the SC-SIC public presence and in facilitating information flow.

**In the Loop:**

*In the Loop* is the latest email blast offering from SC-SIC and replaces the former *Clips and Quips*. It serves to keep SIC members and friends informed of events, dates, news, and other happenings. *In the*

**Council News:**

**SC-SIC listserv:**

At this time the primary SC-SIC listserv of members and friends consists of over **11,300** email addresses. Addresses are deleted by individual request; subscribers are also able to independently leave the list. While exact numbers are not available, judging by the small number of returned emails received we have reason to believe that the great majority of these emails are valid.

**Other listservs:**

SC-SIC also maintains listservs for school principals, SC-EPFP graduates and friends, School Improvement Council Chairs, and SIC District Contacts.

**Karen Utter, SC-SIC Program Coordinator****Programs and Research****Activities related to *Engagement for Outcomes Pilot***

- Attended monthly SIC meetings at the four schools participating in the pilot program.
- Provided technical support to SICs related primarily to activity planning and implementation and assessment of results.
- The SIC that had experienced problems with organizational capacity at the end of the prior school year now has a strong membership in place and is implementing and tracking outcomes of strategies to increase levels of family engagement at school events.
- The SIC in Greenville School District has completed plans for the first in a series of events to promote greater student interest and family engagement around science. Implementation will begin with anticipation-building and publicity activities in December and carry through until the main event in March.
- The SIC in Oconee County has begun implementation of the program it planned last year to provide after-school homework help to students. The SIC's efforts to re-establish a PTO at the school is meeting with great success. The SIC's family engagement committee is working on engaging non-English speaking Hispanic parents and their children by (1) developing a weekly podcast of school events read in Spanish by students, and (2) partnering with the local public library to provide a program for parents that combines access to English lessons at the school's computer lab with information about the kinds of questions that parents can ask teachers and the principal in order to find out how their child is doing.
- The SIC in Marlboro County successfully advocated for development of pilot of Academic Parent Teacher Teams at one grade level at their school.
- Presented session at District Contacts meeting on progress of Engagement for Outcomes program, including specific strategies that can be pursued at the district level to support SIC capacity building.
- Continued work in converting materials, tools and research developed for *Engagement for Outcomes* schools into more generic formats for use by all SICs.

The pilot is scheduled to end in December for those SICs that meet in December. Those SICs that are not scheduled to meet in December due to the holidays will have their final program meeting in January 2015. The Program Coordinator's focus during December and January will be to prepare training modules and materials for the final meeting that specifically address the continuous improvement and sustainability steps of GTO and prepare the SICs as they move forward during the remainder of the year.

**SC-SIC Book Distribution Program**

- We continue to receive and fill requests from SICs for free family engagement texts.



**Publications**

- Completed draft of new SC-SIC handbook intended to replace the current *Basics* handbook.
- Completed first draft of short companion booklet to new SC-SIC handbook that will address FAQs about SIC statutory requirements.

**Meetings**

- Met with representative of Google CS First program, a free after school computer science program sponsored by Google and available to schools serving middle grades in in South Carolina.
- Attended and assisted in facilitating table discussion at 2014 Conference of SC Public Education Partners sponsored by SC Future Minds and CEP.
- Met with Tom and Office Depot representative regarding programs that Office Depot is developing in the area of family and community engagement in schools.

**Read to Succeed**

- Met with Baron Holmes and conferred with Dana Yow at EOC to begin developing concepts for materials, training and technical assistance to SICs that address their new role under Read to Succeed. Next step is to reach out to SC DOE office that is implementing provisions of this law.

**Basics Trainings**

- Conducted Basics trainings in Fairfield, Richland 1, Blackville and Marion school districts.
- Created spreadsheet tracking email addresses of all participants in Basics training to facilitate larger follow-up survey via Survey Monkey at the end of 2014-15 school year.
