SC-SIC Board of Trustees Quarterly Meeting Minutes Friday, June 10, 2016

The meeting was called to order at 10:04 a.m. by Mr. Guarino.

Minutes of the February 26, 2016 Conference Call were presented and approved.

Review of Staff Reports

Mr. Hudson and Ms. Utter presented highlights from their written reports and took questions from Board members. The Board discussed possible strategies to increase the capacity of principals to facilitate the growth of SICs in their schools. Also discussed were suggestions on how to increase SIC visibility among state superintendents, school boards, and other specific school stakeholder groups and the possibility of producing a short motivational video.

Full written reports for Mr. Hudson, Ms. Utter, and Digital & Web Director Claudia Parnell are included at the end of these minutes.

Old Business

- 2016 SIC Annual Meeting Recap. Mr. Hudson reported that the annual meeting was well
 received by participants and that the meeting space at EdVenture Children's Museum
 created an environment that was conducive to interaction with participants.
 Attendance was on par with prior years. Appreciation was expressed to Dr. Torres for
 her presentation with Ms. Mayra Garcia on reaching out to Latino families.
- Board Class Size. A motion was made that beginning with the election of the Class of 2019 (in July 2016), the size of each Board class will be reduced by one (1) member each to five (5) members when each class comes up for election (Class of 2019, July 2016; Class of 2020, July 2017; Class of 2021, July 2018). It was noted that this action does not require an amendment of the bylaws. The motion was seconded and carried.

• Board Web Bios. Mr. Hudson asked board members to update their biographical information as SC-SIC transitions to the new website and to notify Mr. Hudson of any changes, corrections, or additions at their earliest convenience.

New Business

- *SC-SIC Budget*. Mr. Hudson reported to the Board that SC-SIC's funding for the current fiscal year will remain at the same level as last year.
- SC-SIC Summer Work. Mr. Hudson reported that priority is being placed on completing a series of short video training modules that will be available to members through a link on the SC-SIC website. Work is also progressing on additional toolkits and "Read to Succeed" Act materials for SICs.
- *SC-SIC Board and Board Officer Elections*. Board and Board officer elections for the Class of 2019 will be conducted over the summer months.
- Future Meetings Schedule and Format. Mr. Hudson raised for Board consideration and possible action: "that beginning in FY16-17, the SC-SIC Board of Trustees shall hold at least one (1) of its regularly scheduled quarterly meetings via conference call, with the suggestion that the Winter meeting, typically scheduled in January or February, will be conducted in this manner." A brief discussion followed. Determination of the Board's meeting schedule will be made at the Board's next regularly scheduled meeting.

Staff Presentation: It Takes Two to Tango

 Mr. Hudson and Ms. Utter reprised this presentation on the components of effective school outreach to families, which was first given at a session of the SC School Behavioral Conference (Myrtle Beach) in April 2016.

The Board's next meeting is scheduled for Friday, August 26, in Columbia.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:35 p.m.

- Year-end financials for SC-SIC through 06/30 are stable, with adequate resources to provide for expenditures with little to no excess revenue.
- \$1,650 provided by CEP for SC-SIC Digital & Web Director Claudia Parnell to attend Google Analytics training in Columbia.
- \$1,800 provided by CEP to develop a Spanish translation of the SIC Handbook.
- Additional \$2,575 in CEP funding has been tentatively approved for SC-SIC Coordinator of Council Services Karen Utter to attend a five-day seminar, "Closing the Achievement Gap: Strategies for Excellence with Equity," in late June at Harvard University, Boston, MA.
- \$227,303 in total SC-SIC funding included in FY16-17 budget as submitted by the General Assembly to the Governor (\$127,303 in EIA funds through the USC Center for Education Partnerships; \$100,000 from Proviso 20.2 (USC School Improvement Council). We await the Governor Haley's veto message, but anticipate no change as these funds were included in the Executive Budget earlier this year.

SC-SIC Website

The redesigned SC-SIC website is now live and may be viewed at http://sic.sc.gov

SC-SIC Member Network

The total number of schools falling under laws governing SICs as of 06/02/16 is now **1,126.** This is the latest available number reported to us by the schools and/or districts.

The Center of Educational Partnerships (CEP) Website

SC-SIC Digital & Web Director Claudia Parnell has worked with state government's (and SC-SIC's), web hosting agency sc.gov to recreate and update the CEP website. She is currently adding content to the new site in preparation for the launch. She is also enrolled in and will take a class in "Google Analytics" this month, which will enable her to track and determine website traffic for this site and the SC-SIC site. By taking a lead role in accomplishing these duties and functions, SC-SIC becomes an even more key partner with in the CEP.

SIC Report to the Parents Uploads

548 SIC Reports to the Parents for 2015-16 have been uploaded to the Member Network as of 06/02/16. This number represents 49% of all schools mandated to convene SICs. SC-SIC requests that schools upload their Reports by June 1, but they may upload Reports at any time. The trend has been for schools to continue to upload Reports after the June 1 deadline, so we anticipate an increase in this figure. There is no state mandate to upload Reports to the Member Network; April 30 is the state-mandated deadline for schools to distribute Reports to the greater school community.

722 Reports to the Parents were uploaded to the database for the 2014-15 school year by 06/02/16. SICs have demonstrated a willingness to share their Reports via the Member Network and are strongly encouraged to do so by a majority of the school districts. Again, because schools can upload Reports at any time, for any year, this number may increase.

SIC Reports to the Parents are available for public viewing via the "View the SIC Members (Read-Only)" link on the SC-SIC Member Network (https://sic.ed.sc.edu/network)

The *Report to the Parents* offers publicly accessible information about what SICs across South Carolina are planning and accomplishing.

Social Media

The SC-SIC Twitter account now has **2,217** followers (up from **2,138** as of 02/26/16). Use of Twitter by SC-SIC provides a communications conduit to education groups and professionals across the country as well as accelerated access to education and civic engagement news, blogs and journal articles on a wide variety of topics, and immediate contact with the community. Media personnel, political figures, and key education players in South Carolina and beyond follow @SCSIC and often "retweet" or mention @SCSIC (our Twitter "handle") in their tweets, continuing to raise our public profile and advancing a key

@SCSIC strategic planning goal. Among @SCSIC followers are several educators, political figures, organizations, and social media and media professionals from South Carolina, other states, and countries. Also of great use is the accessibility of breaking news obtainable through Twitter lists of media, education outlets, and those involved in the South Carolina political landscape.

The SC-SIC Facebook Page has **702** "Likes," up from **673** as of 02/26/16. Many links to information and articles that are shared on Twitter are also posted here, though less in number due to the real-time posting and faster pace of Twitter.

Facebook, like Twitter, serves to increase our search engine rankings, or SEO, (Search Engine Optimization), advancing SC-SIC's public profile. Social media has proven to be an essential tool in maintaining the SC-SIC public presence and in facilitating information flow.

SC-SIC Listserv

At this time the primary SC-SIC listserv of members and friends consists of approximately 17,759 email addresses. Addresses are deleted by individual request; subscribers are also able to independently leave the list.

Other Listservs

SC-SIC also maintains listservs for school principals, SC-EPFP graduates, local SIC Chairs, SIC District Contacts, and other supporters of SC-SIC.
