

**SC-SIC Board of Trustees  
Quarterly Meeting Minutes  
Friday, May 26, 2017  
Via Conference Call**

The meeting was called to order by Ms. McKie at 11:08 a.m.

**SC-SIC Staff Reports**

Mr. Hudson, Ms. Utter, and Ms. Parnell presented highlights from their written reports and took questions from Board members.

**Old Business**

Mr. Hudson and SC-SIC staff provided a recap of the SC-SIC Annual Meeting held in Columbia on 03/18/17. It was reported that participant evaluations were positive with 117 in attendance. Expenditures and revenues for the meeting were discussed, along with various suggestions to assure paid registrations prior to the event.

**New Business**

Mr. Hudson spoke of SC-SIC funding for the FY2017-18 year, which appears to be sustained at the current level. He also informed the Board of upcoming Board member elections and the need to find new candidates to fill the slots of Gary Alexander (Midlands) and LTC(R) Justin Blum, who will be rolling off the Board due to term limits. Recommendations for Board candidates were solicited, with elections to be held via Doodle Poll during the month of July.

Proposed dates for the Board's first meeting of 2017-18, to be held in Columbia, will also be circulated to Board members by emailed Doodle Poll.

A motion was made to adjourn the meeting by Ms. Sebuck and seconded by Ms. Hooks. The meeting was adjourned at 12:07 p.m.

**Training**

**Year-to-Date 16-17:** 25 sessions statewide, reaching over 800 participants.

Additionally, three (3) online training modules were videotaped and posted to the SC-SIC website in January/February 2017.

**Funding**

- For FY17-18, funding appears in both the House and Senate versions of the budget at \$127,303 in EIA funds, and \$100,000 through USC proviso (a sustained level of funding since FY10-11). The budget conference committee is scheduled to convene in January 2018.
- For the remainder of FY16-17 (ending 06/30/17), SC-SIC’s projected fund balance (with staff salaries and fringe removed) as of 05/09/17 stands at \$1,712.00 (from EIA and USC sources of \$227,303); \$550.00 (from SC-EPFP coordination contract of \$7,350); and \$8,496.00 (SC-SIC’s reserve account, which can be carried over).

### SC-SIC website

The SC-SIC website, redesigned in 2016, may be viewed at *sic.sc.gov*.

### SC-SIC Member Network

The total number of SICs falling under laws governing SICs as of 05/18/17 is **1,127**. This figure includes a few schools that have been allowed to convene “joint” SICs.

**13,403** SIC members were registered with the *Member Network* as of 05/18/17.

### Report to the Parents Uploads

**535** *Reports to the Parents* for school year 2016-17 were uploaded to the *Member Network* as of 05/18/17. SC-SIC requests that schools upload their *Reports* by June 1, but they may upload *Reports* at any time. The trend has been for schools to continue to upload *Reports* after the June 1 deadline, so we anticipate an increase in this figure. There is no state mandate to upload *Reports* to the *Member Network*; April 30 is the state-mandated deadline for schools to distribute *Reports* to the greater school community.

**733** *Reports to the Parents* for school year 2015-16 were uploaded to the *Member Network* as of 05/18/17; **729** were uploaded for the 2014-15 school year. SICs have demonstrated a willingness to share their *Reports* via the *Member Network* and are strongly encouraged to do so by a majority of the school districts. Again, because schools can upload *Reports* at any time, for any year, this number may increase.

The *Report to the Parents* offer publicly accessible information about what Councils across South Carolina are planning and accomplishing.

### Social Media

The SC-SIC Twitter account now has **2,475** followers (up from **2,389** as of 01/27/17). Use of Twitter by SC-SIC provides a communications conduit to education groups and professionals across the country as well as accelerated access to education and civic engagement news, blogs and journal articles on a wide variety of topics, and immediate contact with the community. Media personnel, political figures, and key education players in South Carolina and beyond follow @SCSIC and often “retweet” or mention @SCSIC (our Twitter “handle”) in their tweets, continuing to raise our public profile and advancing a key strategic planning goal. Among @SCSIC followers are several educators, political figures, organizations, and social media and media professionals from South Carolina and other states and countries. Also of great use is the accessibility of breaking news obtainable through Twitter lists of media, education outlets, and those involved in the South Carolina political landscape.

### **Social Media (continued)**

The SC-SIC Facebook Page has **775** "Likes," up from **747** as of 01/27/17. Many links to information and articles that are shared on Twitter are also posted here, though less in number due to the real-time posting and faster pace of Twitter.

Facebook, like Twitter, serves to increase our search engine rankings, or SEO, (Search Engine Optimization), again advancing our public profile. Social media has proven to be an essential tool in maintaining the SC-SIC public presence and in facilitating information flow.

***In the Loop*** (periodic updates for SIC members and friends; delivered via email) - *In the Loop* is the email blast offering from SC-SIC. It serves to keep SIC members and friends informed of events, dates, news, and other happenings. *In the Loop* is sent to all SIC members and supporters who share their email addresses with us; current and archived issues can be found on the SC-SIC website at <http://sic.sc.gov/Pages/IntheLooparchives.aspx>.

***Council News*** (SC-SIC Newsletter; delivered via email) - The *Council News* electronic newsletter is emailed to all SIC members and friends that share their email address with us. Current and archived editions are posted to the SC-SIC website at <http://sic.sc.gov/Pages/CouncilNewsarchives.aspx>.

***DC Digest*** (quarterly newsletter for SIC District Contacts; delivered via email) - *DC Digest* is designed to provide SIC District Contacts with timely information about new materials, upcoming events, suggested strategies for working with SICs, and reminders of upcoming SIC deadlines. Current and archived editions are posted to the SC-SIC website at <http://sic.sc.gov/Pages/SICDistrictContactDigest.aspx>.

***SC-SIC listserv*** - At this time the primary SC-SIC listserv of members and friends consists of approximately **19,367** email addresses. Addresses are deleted by individual request; subscribers are also able to independently leave the list.

***Other listservs*** - SC-SIC also maintains listservs for school principals, SC-EPFP graduates and friends, SIC Chairs, SIC District Contacts, and SC school superintendents.
