## Sixteen local School Improvement Councils named to state SC-SIC Honor Roll for 2017

COLUMBIA – The School Improvement Councils (SICs) of 16 South Carolina public schools have been named to the SC School Improvement Council's (SC-SIC) 2017 Honor Roll for their significant efforts to foster civic engagement in public education.

These Honor Roll SICs will continue in the running for SC-SIC's annual Dick and Tunky Riley Award for School Improvement Council Excellence. Named for the former US Secretary of Education and South Carolina Governor and his late wife, the Riley Award was created in 2002 to recognize the vital contributions made by more than 1,200 local SICs and their nearly 13,000 SIC members across the state.

Part of the Center for Educational Partnerships within the University of South Carolina College of Education, the SC School Improvement Council provides the member training, technical assistance, statutory accountability, and other operational resources necessary for the continued success of the community-based SICs in each of the state's K-12 public schools.
