#### **Engagement for Outcomes Slots are Filling Up Fast**

Engagement for Outcomes (EFO) is SC-SIC's intensive 12-18 month capacity-building program for individual SICs that want to improve their effectiveness in achieving results that improve their schools. An SC-SIC facilitator is assigned to each participating school to deliver ongoing training and technical assistance during regular SIC meetings using the "Getting To Outcomes<sup>TM</sup>" method of strategic planning, implementation, and evaluation. ## SICs and the SC School Report Card Narrative

State law directs that the principal prepare the narrative to the annual *SC School Report Card* "in conjunction with the School Improvement Council," and the narrative is intended to be signed by both the principal and the SIC Chair. We know that principals may not actually write the narrative until after school is dismissed, when SIC members may not be easy to reach. Therefore, we encourage SICs to include this item on a meeting agenda near the end of the school year so that they have an opportunity to discuss the content of the narrative with the principal before the SIC Chair signs off on the final draft.

# It's Not Too Soon To Schedule *Basics* Training for the Coming Year

One issue that regularly comes up in comments on our *Basics* trainings is the timing of the trainings. Members continue to ask for the opportunity to access this training as early as possible in their term of office.

Please keep in mind that if SICs in your district are holding their elections in the spring, SC-SIC staff are available to deliver *Basics* and other SIC trainings over the summer months. Our *Basics* video training modules are also available on the SC-SIC website and can be accessed at any time. It's not too soon to lock in a date for August or September. We want to help your SICs utilize the full school year - and holding an early *Basics* session is key to meeting that goal.
