Part Two - Case Statement

Issue

Since 2006 Greer High School has had the distinction of being an International Baccalaureate high school. For many years the school's vision was often focused on ensuring that students graduated from high school prepared to meet expectations of university standards with success. In today's world, not all students are college bound, and Greer High School has placed great emphasis on all students graduating both college and career ready. The SIC committee recognized the need for all students to be equipped for success beyond the completion of high school, including those not exclusively college-focused. Together we searched for a way to communicate local opportunities and to mind the gap for these students as a part of the educational experience at Greer High School. As the Greer community has grown into a heavy manufacturing area for the state, and in conjunction with the pandemic, Principal Justin Ludley and the school's SIC identified a need to encourage and support trade and technical education. The need for a skilled workforce in Greer is now greater than ever.

A core strength of Greer High School is our diversity. Students have varying backgrounds, skill-sets, interests, and personalities. Currently, the makeup of the student population is 44.9% white, 26.5% Hispanic/Latino, 21% black, 5.6 % two or more races, 1% Asian, and 1% American Indian or Alaska Native. 18% of our students receive Special Education services. 5% of our students have a 504 plan. The current poverty index for Greer High School is 73.4%.

For the 2022 Greer High School graduating class, 27% planned to attend a 4-year college, 42% planned to attend an in-state 2-year college or obtain an in-state Associate's degree, 3% planned to obtain a certificate or attend another type of school, 2% planned to enlist in the Armed Services, and 26% planned to work full-time.

Action Taken

During the first SIC meeting of the 2021-2022 school year, our SIC brainstormed ways to inspire and create awareness for the job opportunities that are available in our community in response to the shortage in the local labor force. Through community relationships and engagement, the SIC brought together Greer business leaders and the school's Career Technology Education (CTE) department to create a think tank. The SIC and stakeholders collaborated monthly to plan the inaugural Greer High School Career and Technology Education Summit for students in grades nine through twelve. The theme of the March 2022 Greer High School CTE Summit was teamwork: Collaboration, Cooperation, and Your Career!

This conference style event invited students to learn about careers, opportunities, and successes from local professionals. Students were introduced to career experiences in manufacturing,

agriculture, health sciences, supply chain, graphic design, business, and more. The event was jointly planned by the SIC, Greer High staff, community leaders, and business partners such as Michelin, PRISMA Health, the Greer Chamber of Commerce, and the SC Department of Commerce.

CTE faculty members recruited professionals from their content area to speak with students about their career experiences. Speakers for the day represented a variety of businesses and careers to include real-estate, health care, small business entrepreneurship, global logistics/supply chain management, government, technology products and solutions, and the chamber of commerce.

Students transitioned between multiple sessions where they learned from our community's best and brightest. This event gave the students at Greer High School key information for building a successful life using targeted technical and academic skills and highlighted techniques and strategies that leaders in their fields deem to be employability skills.

Results

Following the summit, the number of students from Greer High School who applied for CTE programs at the Bonds Career Center increased 130% from 135 applicants in 2021 to 311 applicants in 2022. The 311 applicants from Greer High School submitted 603 total applications with some students applying for multiple programs. 158 Greer High School students received offers to join a program at Bonds Career Center for the 2022-2023 school year and 23 Greer High students were added to the waitlist.

The speakers reflected and shared feedback for our staff. A couple of their comments were: "I saw firsthand that the students were engaged in the discussions and asking insightful questions." "If you all hadn't noted that it was the first one, I would have never known. It was very well organized and I appreciated the warm hospitality of all of the staff. My only suggestion would be to encourage other schools in GCS to do the same. I know it was a wonderful opportunity for the kids, but it was just as rewarding as a presenter. We need more of that!" 11 out of 12 speakers surveyed rated the CTE Summit as a 5 on a scale of 1 - 5. One speaker rated the event as a 4 out of 5. 100% of the speakers indicated that they would like to return and present at the next CTE Summit.

The students were also required to complete an evaluation about their experience. 91% of the students who participated in the summit rated the event at either a 4 or 5 on a scale of 1 to 5. 97% of the participating students indicated that they would sign up again to attend the summit next year and 96% of the students said that they would recommend the summit event to a friend. When asked what they liked most about the conference, a few of the comments included:

"I enjoyed learning from the individuals who spoke and gave us advice/information so we can determine our career choices in the future. I'm very glad I got to attend and experience this event and I can't wait for it to come back next year."

"I liked the diversity of people that came and just the different point of views."

"I liked how much information I received from each speaker. I learned a lot on what to do and what not to do. It opened my mind to what I want or need to do after high school or even during college. It made me have a different mindset."

Finally, one of our students that attended the Greer High CTE Summit last year shared with the current SIC the impact that the summit has had on him.

"I am extremely appreciative of the Greer High School SIC for their development of the GHS CTE Summit. The CTE Summit allowed me to expand my knowledge on fields I am interested in, and fields I am not very familiar with. Not only did it expand my knowledge, it allowed me to reach further into the business world, and attend SC Business Week, a prestigious program in the state of South Carolina, and only 75 students across the state are allowed in. I am now enrolled in 3 CTE classes and plan to continue the business path into college."

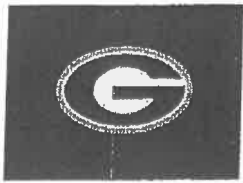

One-Page Narrative - Greer High School's SIC Progress in 2022-2023

The Greenville-Spartanburg area is growing at an exorbitant rate, and the need for a skilled workforce in Greer is greater than ever. During the 2021-2022 school year, Principal Justin Ludley and the school's SIC committee recognized that the Greer community had transitioned into a heavy manufacturing area for the state. In conjunction with the needs the pandemic placed on the local economy and workforce, the Greer High School SIC identified a need to encourage and support trade and technical education. In a continuing effort to prepare students to be both college and career ready, we saw the opportunity to build on the momentum and enthusiasm from our first Career Technology Education Summit and we are currently preparing to bring back this event for a second year. The 2022 Summit hosted by the CTE department, staff, and partners had 190 students in attendance. This year we anticipate that 220 students will attend.

This conference-style event allows students an up-close experience to learn about careers, opportunities, and successes as they engage with local professionals. In continued partnerships with the CTE department, South Carolina Department of Commerce, Greer Made, and Greater Greer Chamber of Commerce, we are encouraged towards our goal of having each student college and or career ready upon graduation from Greer High School. A core strength of Greer High School is our diversity. Students have varying backgrounds, skill sets, interests, and personalities. Following the summit in 2022, the number of students from Greer High School who applied for CTE programs at the Bonds Career Center increased by 130%. This year we are focused on increasing the planning and collaboration efforts between our business partners and teachers before the summit to strengthen the presentations for our students. Another area of fine-tuning will be to condense our breakout sessions to 25 minutes per presentation in each of the four sessions. In addition, this year we will kick off the summit with a keynote speaker before we break out into the main sessions. Our central goal for the Summit this year is to keep improving from our highly successful event last year and to create an even greater impact in the lives of students. The 2023 Greer High School Career and Technology Education Summit will take place on Wednesday, March 8, 2023.
